Ministry's letter NO. Z.28015/117/2017/New Initiatives/PP&C dated 17.05.2018 received from Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH regarding implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (*SDGs).

The Education Committee considered the Ministry's letter dated 17.05.2018 and decided to recommend for amendment in regulation 3 (2) of HCC (MSR) Regulations, 2013 for incorporating the word 'casualty' after the words 'facilities of' (in 5th line) and before the words 'operation theatre'.

Agenda Item No.5

A letter received from Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, AP, Vijaywada regarding Recommendations of the Academic Senate, 2018 of the University.

The Committee considered the matter of Internal Assessment marks for considering the same as part of the BHMS Degree Regulations. The Committee decided that instead of making provision of internal assessment marks in the scheme of examinations, the assessment may be made by the Heads of Departments on the basis of annual classroom performance, practical records/ clinical case discussions, subjects prepared for student seminars and Attendance for allowing the students to appear for final Examination. The final decision in the matter may be taken by principal.

Agenda Item No.6

A letter No. 17656/a/ACI/Ayush/A3/2017 dated 04.06.2018 received from Kerela University of Health Sciences regarding Re-admission of students who fail to clear one or more subject in II, III and final BHMS even after availing four chances including the regular chance clarification sought.

The Education Committee discussed the matter threadbare and decided that every candidate shall complete the BHMS course including the passing of examinations in all subjects and complete the compulsory internship training within a period of 11 years from the date of his initial admission to the first BHMS course, failing which his name shall be removed from the rolls of the college.
